Philanthropic Leadership and Management for African Non Profits



Course Details

Everchanging social, political, economic, and technological trends have generated many new challenges for the nonprofit sector. Factors, such as reduced government and foundation support and increased competition contribute to an environment of financial instability. To help address this need for philanthropic leadership, the Muslim Philanthropic Initiative (MPI) at the Indiana University's Lilly Family School of Philanthropy offers a training in Philanthropic Leadership and Management designed and delivered by the expert faculty. The training provides administrative, financial, technical, and leadership skills for anyone who wish to substantially enhance their skills in philanthropic leadership. This training lifts the communities by providing them the tools to navigate their challenges through the philanthropic and nonprofit sector.

The MPI training in Philanthropic Leadership and Management is designed to strengthen the leadership and management capacity of individuals working in or with nonprofit organizations. The training gives participants the skills necessary to respond to the complex challenges and opportunities facing their organizations and communities. The participants will explore the various aspects of nonprofit management and skills and tools needed for leading in uncertain times. Each individual participant will have the opportunity to create a network of local, national, and international nonprofit leaders committed to working across organizations, communities, and sectors to address public needs. Upon completion of the training, participants will receive a certificate of participation.

DAY 1

24th JULY 2023

Philanthropy and Global Indices

Course Descriptions

This course introduces the history of philanthropy and the nonprofit sector in a comparative perspective. The course demonstrates how the events of the past provide important context for understanding contemporary philanthropy, encompassing charity, reform, foundations, nonprofit organizations, voluntary associations, and individual actors. This course immerses participants into the discussion of how the contemporary definitions and discussions of philanthropy limits our understanding of philanthropy by examining theological and cultural sources to point towards a broader conception of philanthropy. This course will also cover the current trends in philanthropy, the rise of collaborate funding, the challenges of racial equity and social justice within philanthropy.



DAY 2

25th JULY 2023

Leadership

Course Descriptions

Moving beyond the charismatic stories of well-known leaders, this course focuses on the importance of philanthropic leadership and how different leadership traits can be learned and developed. This course is a guide for participants to develop and improve their leadership skills. It draws on universal leadership principles and is applicable to anyone looking to become a better leader. This course will introduce participants to different types of leadership including, but not limited to servant leadership, transformational leadership, and authentic leadership.



DAY 3

26th JULY 2023

Volunteer and Project Management

Course Descriptions

Management and leadership can be entwined but are essentially distinct. Through effective volunteer and project management, nonprofit organizations can build a more strategic, positive experience and cultivate long-term programs. This course will provide an overview of project and volunteer management. Participants in this course will learn insights about volunteer trends, volunteer motivation, volunteer integration, and how to manage volunteer relationships. Participants will also learn project management fundamentals and actionable strategies that can help any nonprofit successfully plan and deliver projects.



DAY 4

27th JULY 2023

Fundraising

Course Descriptions

This course is designed for participants to enhance their understanding of fundraising tools and techniques, while developing leadership and management skills. Participants will obtain knowledge and skills that increase their abilities to best serve in key areas of fundraising and sustainability. This course will focus on important skills of fundraising such as active listening, empathy, emotional intelligence, trust building, and the ethics of fundraising. Successful fundraising is a data-driven management and leadership process. This training will provide an overview of the process, systems and management needed to help your fundraising become a vital program of your organization rather than a sporadic event.

Dr. Shariq Siddiqui is an Assistant Professor of Philanthropic Studies and Director of the Muslim Philanthropy Initiative at the Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy. Shariq has a Ph.D. and M.A. in Philanthropic Studies from the Lilly Family School of Philanthropy. He also has a JD from the McKinney School of Law at Indiana University and holds a B.A. in History from the University of Indianapolis.

Shariq authors research on Muslim philanthropy and the Muslim nonprofit sector. Most recently, he conducted a national survey of full-time Islamic schools in the United States. This project resulted in the book (that he co-authored) *Islamic Education in the United States and the Evolution of Muslim Nonprofit Institutions*, published in November 2017. Shariq also serves as the co-editor of the *Journal of Muslim Philanthropy and Civil Society*, *Journal on Education in Muslim Societies* and as the Series Editor of the *Muslim Philanthropy and Civil Society Book Series*. All three of which are published by Indiana University Press. He has served as a nonprofit practitioner for over 20 years for international, national, regional, and local nonprofit organizations.

Previously, Shariq served as the Executive Director of Association for Research on Nonprofit Organizations and Voluntary Action (ARNOVA). ARNOVA is a leading international association that connects scholars, teachers, and practice leaders in research on nonprofit organizations, voluntary action, philanthropy and civil society.
